
## Party time!

#### Right to Buy

LCA is a charity so, unlike some affordable housing providers, there is no 'Right to Buy' for tenants in our homes.

The Association is also exempt from the 'Right to Acquire' and is not part of the Voluntary Right to Buy scheme.

## Spotlight on ... mutual exchanges

Every Lyng tenant (except for those on starter tenancies when they first become tenants) has the right to exchange their tenancy with another social housing tenant.

So if you have a two-bedroom house on the Lyng and need to move to, for example, Smethwick you can check the Homeswapper lists and see if anyone in Smethwick is looking to move to West Bromwich.

If you see a suitable swap you can contact the other tenant and, if they are interested, you check out each other's properties for location, condition, etc.

If you both like what you see, you each need to contact your own landlord to ask for permission to swap tenancies. YOU MUST GET PERMISSION BEFORE ANY SWAP IS ARRANGED and please remember it is illegal for money to change hands to ease the process.

The landlord will only refuse permission if you or the other tenant have failed to keep to your tenancy conditions (for example, you are in arrears) or if the property is not suited to the family size (for example, a single man wouldn't get permission to swap to a three-bedroom house and a family of four wouldn't get permission to move to a one-bedroom flat).

## Tenants' repairs responsibilities

As Lyng tenants, you are responsible for works to your home such as these:

- internal decoration
- replacing light bulbs (including strip lights in kitchen areas)
- replacing keys and locks (to front and back doors) if you lose
- smoke alarms replacing batteries and testing in between LCA's annual checks
- clearing blockages to sinks and basins
- TV aerials (unless a shared aerial provided by LCA)
- phone lines, satellite/cable TV and broadband connections
- doorbell and chain (unless fitted by LCA or a door entry system)
- garden sheds (unless provided by LCA).


